SPIDER FACES



Burrowers belong to an ancient group of spiders called mygalomorphs. They have strong mouthparts to dig out burrows, and big fangs that move in a vertical direction. Burrowers have strong limbs to catch animals that wander past.

Weavers belong to a more recently evolved group of spiders called araneomorphs. Their fangs close in a horizontal direction, they have long, fine legs to give them better reach across their web and protective features such as a hard spiky body or camouflage colouring.



Hunters are also araneomorphs that actively search for prev. They often possess large eyes, hairy feet for good grip, spiny legs to hold prev and camouflage
