Frogs are amphibians. The word amphibian comes from the Greek word 'amphibios', which means "to live a double life". This refers to most amphibians having two parts to their life cycle - the first in water during the egg and larva stage and the second on land during the adult stage.


Help us save Australia's frogs

Croaks, whistles, bleats and barks – did you know that every frog species makes a different sound? FrogID is Australia's first national frog count created to save some of our most threatened species.

By recording a frog call with the FrogID app you can discover which frogs live around you and help us count Australia's frogs. Here is how you can help:

- Download the FrogID app and create an account at **FrogID.net.au**
- Explore your local neighbourhood and listen out for the calls of your local frogs
- Record any calls and match them to similar calls on the FrogID app
- Wait for your call to be verified by the Australian Museum team of scientists

Download the FrogID app now to become a Citizen Scientist and help us save some of our most threatened species.
